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Assignment

Draw a blind contour iguana from a photo reference using wax crayon, then outline in artist's tape (using both torn and straight edges). Color in with orange

wax crayons. Add layer of dark grey acrylic paint, let dry. Scratch through with a nail or push pen for texture. Remove tape and add details.



Then...

Chase Rabbits... I mean, Iguanas!

After you have completed the #1 assignment, keep going and keep making art with your chosen subject. What did you like or not like about the crayon assignment? Tweak something for the next one. Experiment with your supplies. Cut stencils. Draw realistically or make some with your eyes closed. Make something 3D and paint that.

"Chase" the idea for as long as you can!

with adding texture.

Cut out a positive-shaped stencil and make a poster using silver spray paint on found paper!
